<u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u>: Jim Milanowski from the Genesee Health Plan spoke about how they help people with health care coverage. They are located on Linden Rd, south of Corunna. There is a health care services millage on the November ballot that will renew this service. Anthony Brown commented about medical marihuana being on the ballot.

• <u>MOTION</u> by Arnold <u>SECOND</u> by Richard to add 2B to the agenda Discussion of the Medical Marihuana Ordinance. One (1) No and Six (6) Ayes. Motion carried.

#### **MATTERS OF COUNCIL ACTION:**

- 1. APPROVAL OF 09/20/18 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES: There is an amendment Mr. Bigelow led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- **MOTION** by Richard **SECOND** by Arnold to approve the September 20, 2018 meeting minutes as presented with the one amendment. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

- 2. APPROVAL OF CHECK REGISTER & TREASURER REPORT: Prior to roll call vote, Gross questioned the bill from Mid Michigan Contracting for work done on M57. She questioned if we would be reimbursed for this from MDOT. She was told yes.
- <u>MOTION</u> by Richard <u>SECOND</u> by Arnold to approve the check register and treasurer report.
   Roll Call Vote: Bigelow Aye, Sanborn Aye, Arnold Aye, Gross Aye, Richard Aye, Heslop Aye, and Mayor Brown Aye. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 2B. DISCUSSION OF THE MEDICAL MARIHUANNA ORDINANCE: Mayor Brown has a concern because as a council, they passed putting on the ballot a specific language for a proposal and she has found out the draft ordinance has been changed. She is questioning the legality of that and questioning putting a cap on the numbers of facilities, transporting, growing, testing and processing the city will allow that was approved at the last council meeting. There was discussion about the cap numbers on the facilities, transporting, growing, testing, and processing and how the zoning board should determine the numbers. There was also discussion about the draft ordinance.
- 3. DISCUSSION DIRECTION RE: REFUSE SERVICES: Rankin said the city received one returned proposal from Republic Services. The pricing they propose would increase \$3.17 per month per household. This is a 26% increase. Last year revenue from the special assessment was \$78,650.00 and expenditures were \$78,647.00 or \$149.00 per household. The first year increase would have an assessment of \$181.03 to generate \$99,594.00. Increases would be 3% each year for 5 years or \$203.76 at the end of the contract. The pricing in the last contract was 3% annual increases which fall close to the CPI. The contract and our fiscal year do not run concurrently; therefore, the fund will run a deficit until July 1<sup>st</sup> where the amount can be adjusted to cover the difference between the fiscal year and contract. There was discussion about negotiating a different price or extending the current agreement and having council members help with the negotiations. Ryan Heslop and Deb Gross volunteered to help negotiate a contract with Republic rep and bring something back to the next meeting.
- 4. DISCUSSION DIRECTION RE: INTEREST CHARGE ON STREET ASSESSMENT: Rankin spoke about the interest assessed on the Alfred Street project and a letter that came in from a resident addressing the interest on the assessment and not being informed in enough time to pay the assessment before the interest was applied. Rankin said the city sent a notice in May 2018 and did provide more than thirty days to make payment. The special assessment ordinance was followed step by step. The reason for the interest is the city has already paid for the project and therefore, is losing interest had this money been sitting in a bank account. Arnold said the notice that was sent to the residents did not have a specific date when interest would be charged or any mention of interest. Mayor Brown said that every public hearing regarding the street assessment interest was discussed. Arnold argued that most people do not come to those meetings and the notices that were sent never mentioned interest. There was discussion about having the Planning Board review the special assessment ordinance and make changes to address the interest.

- <u>MOTION</u> by Richard <u>SECOND</u> by Bigelow to send the assessment ordinance to the Planning Board to address the issues at hand on assessment notices that notification interest will be in that as well. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
  - Prior to roll call vote Gross commented that you can't go back and change a written ordinance and mix and match what we want to. If we fix the ordinance now, we're going against the adopted ordinance. Sanborn asked if there is language on the ordinance that stipulates proper notification. Rankin said no. Sanborn said that is what needs to be added.
- <u>MOTION</u> by Arnold <u>SECOND</u> by Richard that we waive the interest on this specific special assessment for the last billing period that was assessed to them in the July tax rate. Roll Call Vote: Heslop No, Gross No, Sanborn No, Arnold Aye, Richard Aye, Bigelow No, and Mayor Brown No. Five (5) No's and Two (2) Ayes. Motion Denied.
- 5. OPEB/GASB 78 ACTURIAL VALUATION REPORT: Rankin said in 2016 the city had an OPEB valuation. The GASB has changed and a new evaluation has to be done before the audit. The auditors will be here in two weeks. Due to the limited number of people who do this, the auditors recommended Watkins Ross. The proposal from Watkins Ross is in the amount of \$4,000.00 for the initial valuation with the option to complete future valuations for \$1,300.00. There was discussion about the cost and the periods the valuations cover.
- <u>MOTION</u> by Bigelow <u>SECOND</u> by Arnold to accept the proposal from Watkins Ross in the amount of \$4,000.00 with the option to complete future valuations for \$1,300.00. Roll Call Vote: Bigelow Aye, Heslop Aye, Sanborn Aye, Gross Aye, Richard Aye, Arnold Aye, and Mayor Brown Aye. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 6. APPROVAL OF MASTER PLAN UPDATE: Rankin said the updates were made.
  - <u>MOTION</u> by Richard <u>SECOND</u> by Gross to adopt the master plan. Roll Call Vote: Gross –
    Aye, Bigelow Aye, Arnold Aye, Sanborn Aye, Richard Aye, Heslop Aye, and
    Mayor Brown Aye. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 7. GENESEE COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN: Rankin said the regional planning committee would like the city to make a statement to FEMA that says we are still intending on being part of this plan.
- **MOTION** by Bigelow **SECOND** by Richard that our mayor, date and fill this out and sign her name and title to this letter to FEMA. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 8. 2018-2024 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Rankin said the Capital Improvement Plan was updated and approved by the Planning Board. Prior to roll call vote Bigelow questioned the water well restoration back up water source plan for roughly 1.3 million. His question was "why are we looking to refurbishing our wells versus trying to bring in a second water source through the county line?" Gross said this was supposed to be a backup plan. Mayor Brown said this is really the backup water supply and project details to be determined. There was discussion about the water source and items on the improvement plan.

- <u>MOTION</u> by Gross <u>SECOND</u> by Richard to approve the 2018 to 2024 Capital Improvement Plan as presented. Roll Call Vote: Arnold – Aye, Richard – Aye, Sanborn – Aye, Gross – Aye, Bigelow – Aye, Heslop – Aye, and Mayor Brown – Aye. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 9. RESOLUTION RE: UPDATE CDBG SIGNATURE CARD: Rush said this is a biannual renewal of the CDBG signature card.
- <u>MOTION</u> by Gross <u>SECOND</u> by Richard to approve the resolution updating the CDBG signature card to current dates as presented. Roll Call Vote: Richard Aye, Bigelow Aye, Sanborn Aye, Gross Aye, Heslop Aye, Arnold Aye, and Mayor Brown Aye. All Ayes. Motion Carried.
- 10. SET HALLOWEEN TRICK-OR-TREAT HOURS: Rankin said last year the hours were 6-8 pm. This should be the same hours for this year.

She also said there needs to be a limit on people who don't pay property taxes. A lady wanted longer Halloween hours.
